Christie Family Solutions includes Intensive In-Home Support and Stabilization to children and their families. Treatment Foster Care provides treatment for children whose mental health issues are preventing them from living in their own homes or in 'traditional' foster care. Residential programs include the Children's Receiving Center (CRC), a 24-hour crisis response and prevention program which is designed to provide short-term safety and comfort to severely traumatized children. Christie After Hours offers short-term shelter care for children who have no other available placement in the system of care and may have a history of mental health or behavioral challenges. ChristieCare also provides residential treatment to children requiring a 24-hour therapeutic setting in order to address their behavioral and mental health needs.
