INFORMATION AND REFERRAL PROGRAM: Comprehensive Information and Referral (I&R) program provides information on Clackamas County resources over the telephone and person to person. Staff respond to requests from individuals, public and private sector organizations. See the telephone number above for the Spanish Information and Referral line. Produce and maintain online directory, at www.clackamas.us/socialservices/rguide.

Sponsors a community "Networking" I & R meeting on the fourth Thursday of each month. Speakers from agencies provide an overview of their services. Open to everyone. Announcements and information are shared. Call for Clackamas County Community Resource Posters. **CASE MANAGEMENT:** Self-sufficiency case management services for low-income families with children, who are residents of Clackamas County. Provides case management for up to 30 families including: families living at the emergency church shelters in Lake Oswego and Aurora; the Jannsen Street Transitional Housing Project; families participating in the Housing Stabilization Program; and families referred by the community. Case Manager conducts intake assessment to establish needs and set goals to achieve self-sufficiency. Also provides information and referral, advocacy, and crisis intervention services. Agencies can call and advocate for a family to be considered for case management. This program does not provide services to persons with drug or alcohol addictions, persons over 55, or persons with serious or persistent mental illness. Families placed in the emergency church shelters are referred by Annie Ross House. Families placed at Jannsen Street are nominated by Annie Ross House and Clackamas Women's Services. Families participating in the Housing Stabilization are referred by DHS; families served by self-sufficiency programs are nominated by the community and evaluated by a panel composed of representatives from a variety of agencies. **ENERGY ASSISTANCE:** Utility Bill Payment Assistance: The Energy Assistance Program coordinates the distribution of these funds to residents of Clackamas County. LIEAP, OLGA, Oregon Energy Assistance Program (OEAP), Gas Assistance Program (GAP) and Oregon Heat. Spanish and Russian speaking staff available. **HOUSING RIGHTS AND RESOURCES PROGRAM:** General housing information and referral is provided regarding landlord-tenant, fair housing, and other housing-related issues. Assists clients with filing housing discrimination complaints with HUD. Provides training on related topics. Current lists of lower cost housing in Clackamas County and shelters in the Portland Metropolitan Area are available. Screening for the Annie Ross House family shelter program occurs via this program. Those interested in the Annie Ross House family shelter program should call for information and screening by the Housing Rights and Resources Coordinator. Clackamas County Community Action Agency's citizen advisory board conducts program and system advocacy activities to support legislation and funding for services to low-income residents of Clackamas County. **VOLUNTEER CONNECTION:** Programs include: Good Neighbor Program; Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP); Senior Companion Program (SCP); Senior Health Insurance Benefits Assistance (SHIBA); Transportation Reaching People (TRP); and Volunteer Financial Services. Food boxes available once every two months. Bread: fresh bread is available Monday-Thursday 10am-noon and 1pm-3pm Formula/baby food and diapers, depending on availability. Call first. Congregate hot meals served Monday-Thursday at 5pm, Friday at 6pm and Saturday at 4pm. Free clothing available includes baby, maternity, work and school clothes, and shoes. Accept donations of usable clothing between 10am-Noon, M-TH. Household goods available, including bedding and kitchenware. Accept donations of usable items from the community. Prescription assistance, provided via vouchers to a designated pharmacy, available on a limited basis. When funds available, assistance is limited to prescriptions written by medical doctors and nurses only, and for non-narcotic medicine only. No assistance for prescriptions written by non-medical health practitioners, or for nutritional supplements, herbs or vitamins, regardless of prescription. Bus tickets may be available, on a limited basis; call first. Bus ticket provision is restricted to only two bus tickets per year per client, due to limited funding: one ticket to get to location such as job interview or doctor's appointment and one to get back. Bus fare for any other needs, including job application, food bank, etc, is not criteria for obtaining a bus ticket. Community Basket Program: applicants must go in person* to the center on the first Friday of the month between 11am-1pm, complete Community Basket application, and pay membership fee. (* No phone calls are received on Fridays). Available to most Clackamas County residents. Members receive supplemental groceries on the first Friday of each month, and monthly newsletter about community services. Bicycle Repair: Monday 10am-4pm, bicycle repair, parts and service are free of charge. May not be available during winter months - inquire at the center.
